

## Leave it to the Experts? An encouragement to grow in your knowledge of god and his book

Let the elders who rule well be considered worthy of double honor, especially those who labor in preaching and teaching. 1 Timothy 5:17

For my part, I do not believe in the infallibility of experts, and I think that the tyranny of experts is the worst and most dangerous tyranny that ever was devised. J. Gresham Machen

We are constantly inundated with the opinion of experts. Whether we are reading the news on our tablets, listening to our favorite podcasts, or even scrolling through our social media feed, we are constantly faced with a so-called expert dying to give us advice. If we are not careful, we may begin to think that either the experts are always right or that we, as regular people, could never understand the truth the way they do.

I remember once teaching in my first pastorate on the passage that says, "I am the door (John 10:7)". I noticed a hand shoot up near the back of the sanctuary. I recognized the man and asked him what his question was. He said, "What does this say in the Greek?" I was delighted by the question, but a little concerned about what prompted it. See, this man didn't think regular people could understand the Bible, since most don't know Biblical Greek. My response to his question of what this means in the Greek was simply this: "I am the door." Sometimes the obvious meaning is the proper meaning. You don't have to be an expert to understand the Bible.

Let me encourage you, brothers and sisters, to read, study, and think as much as you can about God. As important as public teaching is (and you know I think it is!), we grow a lot quicker and a lot stronger if we study for ourselves. So, why should we study for ourselves and not just leave our instruction to the experts?

#### 1. God made us with a capacity to understand. Because of this, we should try to understand.

What separates us from animals is that we are made in the image of God. Being made in the image of God means that we have the capacity to understand, to reason. Since God made us with this capacity, and it sets us apart from the rest of the created order, we shouldn't leave thinking to experts. We should think for ourselves.

As Jonathan Edwards has said, "God hath given us a book of divine instructions, which contains the sum of divinity. Now, these things hath God done, not only for the instruction of ministers and men of learning; but for the instruction of all men, of all sorts, learned and unlearned, men, women, and children. And certainly, if God does such great things to teach us, we ought to do something to learn."

You are made by the Lord to learn, to read and to think. May He be glorified in your pursuit of truth. The experts can and do help us to understand, but we must think for ourselves. To do so is an act of worship to the God who made us in His image.

### 2. God is honored and glorified when we give Him and His word the attention it deserves.

Where our treasure is, our heart will be also (Matthew 6:21). Similarly, Psalm 119:16 says, "I shall delight in Your statutes; I shall not forget Your word." When God is the focus of our thinking and our attention, we give Him the glory that He deserves. We honor God when our attention is captivated by His truth. After all, the things of God are super interesting! Most of the people in this world have no idea how awesome studying the Bible and theology can be. For those who do not know God, the things of God seem strange and dry. One of the ways we can show the world that God is infinitely worthy of their thoughtful consideration is to show them that He is worthy of ours.

Studying God's word is an indescribable blessing for me, especially because I get to teach it and preach it to you. May our Lord draw us ever closer to Himself through the diligent delight of reading, studying, and thinking. Instead of leaving everything to the experts, maybe we can become experts ourselves.








# The Latest News!


