


### Whatever You Please! can christians do whatever they want?

For what I am doing, I do not understand; for I am not practicing what I would like to do, but I am doing the very thing I hate. Romans 7:15

> "Love God and do as you please." Augustine



Can Christians do whatever they want to do? Well, no. Christians can't do whatever they want to do because sometimes they want to do what they shouldn't do. If they only wanted to do what they should do, then they should do whatever they want to do, but since they often want to do what they shouldn't do, they shouldn't just do what they want to. Confused yet?

Sometimes people are offended at the Christian gospel because they think that it gives a person permission to live as sinfully as they want to live without any fear of punishment. After all, the gospel is by grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone (See Romans 4:5; Ephesians 2:8–9, etc). We are not saved by what we do or what we do not do. Our salvation is not according to our works. It is according to God's grace.

On the other hand, when we sin, are we doing what we want to do, or are we doing what we don't want to do? This is a complicated question, isn't it? After all, our hearts are so deceptive that it is difficult to know what we really want at any given moment. We assume that if we did whatever we wanted to do, we would only sin. I would like to challenge that. Instead, I think that if Christians could do whatever they really wanted to do, they would obey. The problem is that sin makes us do what we don't want to do.

### The gospel affects our will and delights. When we are saved, God changes our "want to."

Sometimes we may think that salvation only changes where we are going when we die. Praise the Lord, it does, but there's more to being saved than that. We may forget that when the Lord saves us, He changes us. He doesn't simply change our eternal address, He changes our internal character.

When I was a very immature believer, I once asked a pastor if I can do whatever I want to now that I had received the Lord. His answer was, "Yes, but God will change your 'want to'!" He was right. God has. Charles Spurgeon once preached, "Some people say, 'Then, sir, you mean to say that Christians may live as they like.' I wish they could, sir. If I could live as I liked, I would always live holily. If a Christian could live as he liked, he would always live as he ought. It is a slavery to him to sin; righteousness is his delight. Oh! if I could but live as I list [incline], I would list to live as I ought. If I could but live as I would, I would live as God commands me. The greatest happiness of a Christian is to be holy."

Remember Paul's lament in Romans 7:19 "For the good that I want, I do not do, but I practice the very evil that I do not want." Paul gave voice to the struggle that all true Christians have experienced. If we could do whatever we wanted to do, we would obey completely. Oh, that we could do what we want to do!

#### The gospel affects our tastes. When we are saved, we begin to hate our sin.

Before we come to know the Lord, sin is our delight. When God enters the picture, we see sin for what it really is. Sin is no longer our delight, but instead it becomes the object of our disdain. We begin to understand our sin to be "... my malady, my monster, my foe, my viper, born in my birth, alive in my life, strong in my character, dominating my faculties, following me as a shadow, intermingling with my every thought, my chain that holds me captive in the empire of my soul" (from *The Valley of Vision*). What once was object of our sinful hearts is now what repulses us in our deepest self.

This is how Paul describes his struggle with sin in Romans 7. He describes his sin as that which he hates (v. 15). He describes himself as a prisoner to it (v. 23) and understands himself to be wretched so long as this conflict continues in his heart (v. 24). He also rejoices to know that this mixed-up half-hearted craving for sin is temporary and that one day all desire for sin will be removed. Let's eagerly anticipate the day in which we can do whatever we want!



On September 13-14, nearly 50 men gathered at CBC for the 2024 Men's Summit, where our global friend Ron Hamme challenged us with the theme Building Holy Faith in an Ungodly World from the book of Jude. On Friday night, we delighted in smoked meats prepared by Nic Daugherty and other sides prepared and served by a wonderful team of ladies. What a joy to work together in the Lord! That night, Ron spoke of our identity in Christ: loved, called, kept, servants, builders, contenders. As usual, we concluded our evening with ice cream. On Saturday, we enjoyed a delicious breakfast, snacked on Renovah pretzels, filled up on lunch, and grabbed one more snack in the afternoon.

These eating times surrounded two more speaking sessions by Ron, in which we were reminded to beware of the "creeps" who think, act, and do wicked things because of their denial and rejection of Jesus as Lord. In our final session, we were instructed to have compassion on those who doubt and always be ready to give an answer for the hope we have. Twice on Saturday, small groups of men discussed what they were learning and applied it to their faith. During the morning group session, the men threw axes at two recently finished targets. The team with the most points received Erwin Lutzer's *We Will Not Be Silenced*, and the top-scoring individual received a set of three throwing axes. Congratulations to the winners! As always, we appreciate how folks come together not only to put on events but make them run with ease, allowing the men to learn and be built up in the holy faith in Jesus. CBC's Language Ministry entered the summer with one less teacher and no childcare workers. Over the summer months God sent us one new teacher, one new assistant, and two new childcare workers. He also gave us three other CBC members who have agreed to substitute for us if necessary. God provides for His work and we are grateful. We welcome soon-to-be new CBC member Lois Innerst as the teacher for our Level 3. We also welcome Stacie James from Providence Church as an assistant in Level 3. We are also very grateful to Jenna Parichuk and Karen Buch

who are doing double duty working with 8 of our language students' children in the Awana program and then caring for them until their parents' classes end 30 minutes later.

So far this year God has sent us 72 students from 14 different countries (Argentina, China, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Guatemala, Haiti, Mexico, Peru, Puerto Rico, Ukraine, and ?) Those countries include six different languages (Chinese, French/Haitian Creole, Spanish, Russian, and Arabic). We are still making appointments for new registrations although a waiting list has been started because we have limited class sizes.

Well, sometimes the students make appointments to register. Other times they just show up. One Arabic-speaking student just showed up for a Wednesday class and was invited to sit in on the Level 4 class. During the Bible devotional time, the student countered each point with what the Koran had to say also. Another student shared that he used to be Christian, but is now Buddhist because during his recovery from a serious accident the Buddha helped him a lot. The majority of our students do not attend any church. Most of those who do, attend a Catholic church, but some attend an evangelical church.

Please pray for each of the volunteers on the teaching teams in this ministry, that we continually seek God's guidance, wisely make the most of each opportunity we are given, and that our witness continues not just during the Wednesday night classes but also into the community throughout the weeks and months ahead. One of our teaching teams has invited their class and the family members of the class to a meal in their home—23 people signed up! Pray for this relational ministry as we welcome these newcomers and neighbors into our homes and workplaces.

There is a bulletin board across from Mike Robison's Sunday School classroom that has some pictures of the English Language Ministry and shows which countries were home to our students. We are praying for more teachers and helpers so that we can better meet the needs of the students God has sent us. We hope to offer "Open House" opportunities sometime soon.
