






As the community dropped off the goodies, we had a team of volunteers assembling the bags on the inside. The bags themselves contained first the Hope Pack book that some of you helped provide through your financial donations (thank you), a calendar and notebook pack that was also donated, a pair of socks from the Salvation Army, an apple from the prison kitchen, a datebook, two bags of chips or pretzels, two Pop Tart or granola packs, two hot chocolates, and a large handful of candy.

We delivered a bag to every one of the over 1,050 inmates in YCP that day. Were they grateful? Yes! We announced that the bags were from churches and individuals who wanted to remember the inmates at this Christmas season.
