Mount Preachmore:

THE MOST INFLUENTIAL PREACHERS IN MY LIFE, PART ONE

We all have heroes. We all look to somebody (or multiple somebodies) as examples of what we are trying to be and to achieve. Musicians may look to Mozart or Jimi Hendrix. Poets may look to Keats or Tennyson. Preachers have heroes too. This month, I wanted to begin to share my Mount Preachmore...my six (three this month and three the next) preachers that have had the most influence on me as a preacher.

Before we get to the list, there is a caveat that I must make: Appreciating a preacher doesn't mean that I agree with him on every single point of doctrine. Preachers are not our authority on doctrinal things; the Bible is. In appreciating these men, I obviously feel very free to disagree with them on secondary or tertiary things.

John MacArthur—Preaching with Precision

Taking the Bible seriously, treating the Bible reverently and expounding the Bible confidently takes a great deal of precision. In my opinion, nobody has preached with more precision, consistency and longevity in the last 50 years than John MacArthur. He has preached verse-by-verse through the entire New Testament and in doing so has resisted the urge to be "current" or "hip" or even all that creative. For these reasons, he has been a trusted resource for those of us who ask the question, "What does this verse mean?". As he nears the end of his life and ministry, I praise the Lord for the steadfast example he has left for all those who will follow.

John Piper—Preaching with Passion

Sometimes preachers give the sense that what they are preaching is merely academic or merely a result of their thought life. This is not the case with John Piper. His passion for the Lord and for theology and for the Bible is contagious. In his preaching he reminds us that

what we are handling when we preach the word of God is something momentous and glorious. It must not only inform us, it must move us! Piper's commitment to Expository Exultation (rejoicing in the truth of the text) has not only served to inform my sensibilities as a preacher, but more importantly has helped me to grow more passionate as a Christian.

Alistair Begg—Preaching with Personality

Some preachers seem to only want to confront you, to make you feel bad, or even to shame you. Preaching does involve that sometimes, but much more important to preaching is the desire to win you, to convince you and to stir you. Alistair Begg will never be known for his depth, although he handles the text masterfully. Instead, Begg will be known for his gracious winsomeness. He has a way of speaking that makes you want to learn more and to grow more. He also has a humor and a wit that makes some of the more difficult pills easier to swallow. They say never to meet your heroes .I met Alistair Begg and found him to be just as charming and winsome in personal conversations as he is from the pulpit.

We preachers exist for the good to the people, not the other way around. Preaching is not as easy as it looks, and perhaps not as prestigious as it seems. Without faithful, godly examples, the pressing tasks of expository ministry would be even more difficult. Next month, I will share three more examples of faithful, effective preachers to whom I look to as examples.

Elder Update

The first elder meeting on March 13th considered the larger maintenance needs of our facility. It has been almost 25 years since the sanctuary remodel and the foyer and office expansion. Over the next months we will be getting a better idea of the scope and costs of this work. We desire to be good stewards of what the Lord has provided. In addition to keeping our facility safe, comfortable, and welcoming, new and efficient systems can significantly reduce our utility bills.

We had our annual Elder Retreat in the morning of March 21. After prayer, we broke into rotating groups to brainstorm three questions:

- ·What are CBC's blind spots?
- ·What needs does CBC meet in Hanover?
- ·What lies ahead for CBC that excites or concerns you?


After reviewing everyone's answers, we came to consensus that the Word of God is our priority; after all, "Bible" is our middle name. We agreed on a number of areas to focus on, including Sunday School, teacher training, and stewardship of our resources. Some next steps were decided, with elders assigned to work on each.

The elders and deacons met together during our February 27 meeting to evaluate the deacon program, which is in its second year. We are thinking over the role of deacons, and of how volunteers might be organized for other kinds of service. We also discussed offering a leadership class.
